

PRIVACY POLICY

Your privacy is important to us. This Privacy Policy (this “**Privacy Policy**”) describes how Timeglass, Inc. (“**Timeglass**”, “**we**”, “**us**”, or “**our**”) may collect, use, store, disclose, process, and transfer your personal information through your access to or use of Timeglass products and services, including those at <https://www.timeglass.ai/>, as well as any subdomains, website of ours that links to this Privacy Policy, related websites, and other offerings (collectively, the “**Services**”). By using the Services you signify your acceptance of this Privacy Policy. If you do not agree to this Privacy Policy, please do not use the Services. Timeglass may change this Privacy Policy from time to time by posting changes at [timeglass.ai/privacy](https://www.timeglass.ai/privacy) and may send notification emails regarding such changes. Your continued use of the Services following the posting of such changes will be deemed your acceptance of those changes, unless additional consent is required.

Privacy Policy Applicability

This Privacy Policy applies when you use or access the Services or share information with Timeglass. Timeglass may act as a processor when our customers use the Services, in which case we act as a processor on behalf of our customers, who are the controllers of personal data.

This Privacy Policy applies when you use or access the Services or share information with Timeglass. By accessing or using the Services, you consent to this Privacy Policy. Timeglass may update this Privacy Policy at any time. If you do not consent to this Privacy Policy for any reason, please do not access or use the Services or share your information with us. Please note that this Privacy Policy applies only to the Services and not to any other third-party website linked to or from it, or any third-party website in which Timeglass’ content or functionality is embedded. We do not control the privacy policies or practices of others.

Information We Collect about You

In general, we receive and collect all information you provide via the Services, including through website input fields, phone, email (including email campaigns), or other such ways. This includes personal information that can identify or relates to you, including, but not limited to:

You have the choice regarding what information you share and the Services you want to engage. You can choose not to provide information to us, but in general, some information about you is required in order for you to access certain functionalities of the Services.

We may periodically obtain information about you from our customers (including your employer or the entity to which you provide services as applicable, affiliated entities, partners and other independent third-party sources and will add it to our database of information, including any information that you provide to third parties that are associated with or whose products or services are integrated with the Services. For example, your employer may provide us with your job description.

We may use cookies, log file technologies, web beacons, device identifiers, session replay technologies, and similar tracking technologies, including those from third-party service providers like Google Analytics and other cloud-based tools, to automatically collect your preferences, performance data, and information about your web usage when you visit the Services. For example, we may collect your IP address, device and Internet service provider information, Web browser details and the address of any referring website. We may also collect information about your online activity, such as pages viewed. This may include collecting geolocation signals from your IP address or device settings to determine your location. By collecting and using this information, we may operate and personalize the Services for you and may also combine this data with other information we have collected about you. We honor Global Privacy Control (GPC) signals. When your browser sends a GPC signal (a setting available in browsers like Firefox, Brave, and DuckDuckGo, or through browser extensions), we automatically treat this as a valid request to opt out of the sale or sharing of your personal information as required by California, Colorado, and Connecticut law. Sensitive Information. Timeglass does **not** collect any sensitive personal information through our Services. Sensitive personal information, as defined by applicable data protection laws, includes information relating to your race, ethnicity, religious beliefs, moral beliefs, philosophical beliefs, sex life, sexual orientation, gender identity, political opinions, trade union membership, citizenship status, national origin, status as a victim of crime, medical information (including mental health), genetic data, biometric data, or financial information (such as account numbers). We also do not collect any information about criminal convictions or offenses.

Cookies

Cookies, also known as tracking cookies or browser cookies, and similar technologies such as web beacons, clear GIFs, pixel tags, and JavaScript (collectively, “**Cookies**”) are small pieces of data, usually text files, placed on a computer, tablet, phone, or similar device when you use that device to access the Services. We use the following types of Cookies:

- **Essential Cookies.** Essential Cookies are necessary for providing you with the Services and features that you requested. For example, these Cookies allow you to log into and stay logged into secure areas of the Services, save language preferences, and more. These Cookies are required to make the Services available to you, so they cannot be disabled.

- **Functional Cookies.** Functional Cookies are utilized to record your choices and settings, maintain your preferences over time, and recognize you when you return to our Services. These Cookies help us personalize our content for you, greet you by name, and remember your preferences.
- **Performance/Analytical Cookies.** Performance/Analytical Cookies allow us to understand how visitors (like you) use the Services. These Cookies accomplish this by collecting information about the number of visitors to the Services, what pages visitors view the most, and how long visitors view specific pages. These Cookies also help us measure and manage the performance of our advertising campaigns in order to help us improve the campaigns and the Services' content. For example, Google LLC ("**Google**") uses cookies in connection with its Google Analytics services. Google's ability to use and share information collected by Google Analytics about your visits to the Services is subject to the Google Analytics Terms of Use and the Google Privacy Policy. How We Use Your Information

We process your personal information with your consent or as needed to provide you the Services. We may also use your personal information to comply with legal obligations, operate our business, protect the vital interests of you, our customers, or the public, or for other legitimate interests of Timeglass as described in this Privacy Policy.

More specifically, we may use your personal information to:

- **Optimize and improve the Services.** We continually try to improve the Services based on the information and feedback we receive from you and our other users, including by optimizing the content on or functionalities of the Services.
- **Personalize the user experience.** We may use your information to measure and optimize engagement with the Services and to understand how you and our other users interact with and use the Services and other resources we provide.
- **Improve customer service.** Your information helps us to more effectively develop the Services and respond to your support needs.
- **Process transactions.** We may use the information you provide to fulfill your requests. We do not share this information with outside parties except to the extent necessary to provide the Services and related activities.
- **To send periodic communications.** The communication methods you provide through our contact forms will be used to send information and updates pertaining to the Services. It may also be used to respond to your inquiries or other requests. If you opt into our mailing list, you may receive emails that include Timeglass news, updates, product offerings and service information, and marketing material. If at any time you would like to unsubscribe from receiving future emails, we include detailed unsubscribe instructions at the bottom of each email or you may contact us via the contact information below. Please note that if you unsubscribe from promotional emails, you may still receive communications related to your subscription, your purchase, or other necessary functionalities of the Services.

- **Carry out other legitimate business interests.** We may use the information you provide to carry out other legitimate business purposes, as well as other lawful purposes.

We may use any aggregated information (as described below) for any purpose.

How We Share Your Information

We share your information with our partners, service providers, contractors, agents, and third-party vendors indicated in the “Information We Collect from You” section as needed to fulfill Services, including for artificial intelligence (“AI”) processing as further discussed below. Please note that our partners may contact you as necessary to obtain additional information about you, facilitate any use of the Services, or respond to a request you submit.

Third-party vendors who provide products, services or functions on our behalf may include cloud database providers, data analytics companies, customer service vendors, AI vendors, communications service vendors, marketing vendors, and security vendors. Third-party vendors have access to and may collect personal information only as needed to perform their functions, may only use personal information consistent with this Privacy Policy and other appropriate confidentiality and security measures, and are not permitted to share or use the information for any other purpose.

We also may share your information:

- In response to subpoenas, court orders, or other legal process; to establish or exercise our legal rights; to defend against legal claims; or as otherwise required by law. In such cases we reserve the right to raise or waive any legal objection or right available to us.
- When we believe it is appropriate to investigate, prevent, or take action regarding illegal or suspected illegal activities; to protect and defend the rights, interests, or safety of our company or the Services, our customers, or others; or in connection with our Terms of Service and other agreements with customers of which you may be affiliated.
- In connection with a corporate transaction, such as a divestiture, merger, consolidation, or asset sale, or in the unlikely event of bankruptcy.

Other than as set out above, we will attempt to notify you when your personal information will be shared with third parties.

Personal Information You Post in Public Areas. When you post a message in a Timeglass forum, chat room, message board, review, or customer feedback, the information you post may be accessible to other users of the Services and the public. If you post personal information anywhere on the Services that is accessible to other users or the public, you are advised that such personal information can be read, collected, used, or disseminated by others and could be used to send you unsolicited information or for other purposes. Accordingly, you assume full risk and responsibility for posting such information and agree that Timeglass is not responsible in any way for personal information you choose to post in these public areas.

Aggregated Information. We may use, publish, share, distribute, or disclose personal information that has been aggregated with information from other users and otherwise anonymized and de-identified in a manner that does not allow third parties, including Timeglass partners, customers, and vendors, to de-identify the data or identify it as originating from you. Such information may help Timeglass identify and analyze training, demographic, and psychographic trends and information and report to third parties how many people saw, visited, or clicked on certain content, areas of the Services, or other materials. We may also use such data for research purposes and optimizing the Services' functionality.

AI Processing. We use third-party AI inference services to help us generate Timesheet Reports, Invoices, activity summaries and other time and billing summaries to you in connection with the Services, under a zero-data-retention architecture. In connection with this activity, the following types of information are analyzed by AI models served through OpenRouter, Inc.: (i) screenshots of your active windows or desktop (including documents, websites and communications visible at the time of capture); (ii) logs of applications used; (iii) keystroke and mouse activity metrics (not the content of the keystrokes); and (iv) application usage metadata. Our requests are technically restricted to inference endpoints verified to operate zero data retention, operated by named U.S. inference providers (currently Parasail and Weights & Biases), which process content in memory to generate a response and do not store, log, or use your information to train AI models; OpenRouter does not store prompt or response content and retains request metadata only. Meeting audio (where enabled) is captured on your device by an on-device recording component, uploaded only to our own cloud storage, and transcribed and summarized using Google Gemini via Google Vertex AI with zero data retention, under the Google Cloud Data Processing Addendum. Where a workspace enables the optional AI assistant, chat requests are processed by OpenAI, which does not use API content to train its models. This information is processed **only** to provide the Services. We do not use AI processing for employee performance evaluations or unrelated profiling, and we do not permit any AI provider to use your personal information for training its AI models. Groq, previously used for text inference, is being phased out in favor of the providers described above; zero data retention remains enabled, it never receives screenshot images, and it is not in active use in connection with the Services. How We Store and Secure Your Information

Personal information collected by Timeglass may be stored and processed in your region, in the United States, and in any other country where Timeglass or its affiliates, subsidiaries, or service providers operate facilities. These countries may have data protection laws that are different to the laws of your country (and, in some cases, may not be as protective). However, we have taken appropriate safeguards to require that your personal information will remain protected in accordance with this Privacy Policy. Meeting audio, where enabled, is captured by an on-device recording component embedded in our desktop application; the component operates entirely locally and does not transmit audio or metadata to its vendor. Recordings are uploaded only to our own cloud storage for transcription as described in the AI Processing section, and meeting participants are presented with a consent flow before recording.

Timeglass takes technological and organizational measures designed to protect your personal information against loss, theft, and unauthorized access, use, disclosure, or modification. For example:

- We transmit data over secured communication channels using SSL Login credentials;
- All personal information is stored by trusted third party providers (e.g., HubSpot, Clerk, Supabase, and Google Cloud Platform (GCP));
- All systems used to provide the Services are password protected;
- All Services usage is restricted on a per-user basis on the principle of least privilege; and
- All data is encrypted during transfer and while at rest.

Security and Compliance

Timeglass is SOC 2 Type II Certified. We have completed an independent SOC 2 Type II audit, which verifies our security controls for data protection, availability, and confidentiality. A copy of our SOC 2 report is available upon request.

We rely on the security policies of HubSpot's, Clerk, Supabase, and GCP's to protect personal information while stored in their respective controlled facilities. Timeglass currently uses Stripe, Inc. ("**Stripe**") for payment, analytics, and other business services. Stripe collects identifying information about the devices that connect to each of their services. Stripe uses this information to operate and improve the services they provide to Timeglass, including for fraud detection. As with all third-party providers, Timeglass is not a party to any agreement between you and Stripe, and Timeglass does not control Stripe's privacy and data security policies. Timeglass reserves the right to change payment processors at any time.

Timeglass complies with applicable data protection laws, including applicable security breach notification requirements.

Data Retention

Timeglass will retain your information as long as necessary for the purposes outlined in this Privacy Policy, in a manner consistent with our data retention policy discussed in this section, and for a commercially

reasonable time thereafter for backup, archival, fraud prevention or detection or audit purposes or as permitted by applicable law. Timeglass will retain your personal information consistent with the original purpose of collection or as long as necessary to comply with our legal obligations; maintain accurate accounting, financial and other operational records; resolve disputes; and enforce our agreements. We will never retain your information for a period longer than permitted by law.

Workspace administrators may configure the retention period for raw screenshots, including a zero-retention option under which each screenshot is deleted immediately after AI analysis completes. By default, raw screenshots are retained for 90 days, after which they are automatically deleted. Derived activity records (such as minute summaries, activity data, and generated timesheet reports) are retained for as long as needed to provide the Services and are deleted upon verified deletion request or account termination in accordance with this Policy.

We determine the appropriate retention period for personal information on the basis of the amount, nature, and sensitivity of the personal information being processed; the purpose for which it was collected; the potential risk of harm from unauthorized use or disclosure of the personal information; whether we can achieve the purposes of the processing through other means; and applicable legal requirements.

After expiration of the applicable retention periods, your personal information will be deleted. As discussed below, you may have the right to request we delete this information earlier.

Accessing and Updating Your Information

To the extent provided by the law of your jurisdiction, you may:

- Have the right to access certain personal information we maintain about you and request details about how we process it;
- Request certain information regarding our disclosure of personal information to third parties;
- Request that we update or correct inaccuracies regarding your personal information;
- Object to our use of your personal information;
- Ask us to block or delete your personal information from our database;
- Request to download the information you have shared on the Services; and
- Confirm whether Timeglass stores your data in the United States.

You may make these requests and any other inquiries about this Privacy Policy by emailing support@timeglass.ai. Any such requests are subject to the protection of other individuals' rights and

applicable law. Additionally, to help protect your privacy and maintain security, we may take steps to verify your identity before granting you access to the requested information.

Additional Privacy Information

Data Transfer. Our databases are currently located in the United States. Timeglass makes no claim that its Services are appropriate or lawful for use or access outside the United States. If you access the Services from outside the United States, you are consenting to the transfer of your personal information from your location to the United States. You are solely responsible for complying with all local laws, rules and regulations regarding online conduct and access to the Services. By providing us your information, you further consent to its storage within the United States.

Collection of Data from Children. The Services are not directed to children, and you may not use the Services or provide any personal information to Timeglass if you are under the age of 18. We do not collect or process personal information of individuals under the age of 18.

California Resident Privacy Rights.

If you are a California resident, you have the following rights under the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) and California Privacy Rights Act (CPRA):

- Right to Know: You may request information about the categories and specific pieces of personal information we have collected about you.
- Right to Delete: You may request that we delete your personal information
- Right to Correct: You may request that we correct inaccurate personal information
- Right to Opt-Out of Sale/Sharing: You have the right to opt out of the "sale" or "sharing" of your personal information for targeted advertising purposes.
- Do Not Sell or Share My Personal Information
